My Dearly Beloved in Christ,

With deep joy and gratitude, I extend to you my prayerful best wishes for a holy and blessed Christmas. I invite you to pause for a moment and reflect upon these words from the Holy Scriptures...



'Comfort, comfort, ye my people'. (Isaiah 40:1)

'But Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart.' (Luke 2:19)

It is soon to be Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, and I hope that you will take time to celebrate with all the festivities, food, fun, and family. I also hope that you take time to reflect and, yes, ponder just as Mary did on that holy night. 

Pastors' Reports:


