# Happy New Year! Happy 2023!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Every January 1, we celebrate the coming of a new year. This is a time of tradition and celebration as we prepare for what is coming in the next year. We think of what has come before, the highs and lows of the past year, and we look expectantly toward the future to see what is coming this year. One of the traditions from my childhood was a vibrant New Year's Eve party with family. We would gather to play games and tell stories. The larger Works' clan cannot gather without telling great stories. These stories are the cement of my identity even as a man in my late 40s.

There is another great tradition on New Year's Eve that helps to shape the identity of millions of Christians in the United States. Many United Methodists worship together on this night using a service called the Watch Night Service. In case you have never heard of this service, let me explain a little about it. On Dec. 31, 1862, slaves gathered all around the South to pray, worship, sing, and dance. They knew that on January 1, 1863, the very next day, "The Emancipation Proclamation" would take effect, and they would become free. On that New Year's Eve night, they gathered as a church family to tell the stories of God's watchful faithfulness to them even during their darkest days of slavery. They also worshipped and prayed for a bright future of freedom. The service was a perfect mix of remembrance of God's faithfulness in the past and hopeful anticipation of God's providence in the future.

This Watch Night Service is the perfect example of what it means to gather as a church family. Therefore, we gather. We gather to tell the stories of how God has been faithful to us in the past. These stories are often stories of our ancestors in the faith, either from the Hebrew Bible or from our earliest Christian ancestors like Paul and Peter. The stories we share are stories of Jesus' miraculous works among us. These stories and their telling have the power to make us stronger and to keep us going.


We also meet to reflect on those ancient stories and draw implications for how we will live out our future lives. Our gatherings give us hope for the future. They instill a confidence in us that God has been present and will continue to be present with us in our future endeavors. This New Year, I encourage you to celebrate all that God has done for you in the past, and to also look expectantly for the ways that God is going to minister to you in the coming year.

Happy New Year, and may God bless you all with faith, hope, and confidence in 2023!
