My Brothers and Sisters in Christ: Blessings to All of You!

Have you ever heard of the "Blessing of the Throats?" I hadn't. Not until a recent visit with Mary Rita Smith (that's Mary Jo's mother) this past Ash Wednesday. Mary Rita was raised Catholic, and she recounted to me not only the importance of the "Blessing of the Throats" in her own upbringing, but also her own involvement in sharing this ritual with others. It is ordinarily celebrated on February 3, the Feast Day of St. Blaise (also spelled Blase), who was said to have saved a boy from choking on a fish bone. Since the 8th Century, this physician turned bishop has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. If you were to be a part of this ritual today, a priest would touch each side of your throat with two candles that were blessed on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (January 2) and joined together with a red ribbon (a symbol of martyrdom) in the form of a cross. The priest would then make the Sign of the Cross while saying the following blessing: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

I have never participated in a "Blessing of the Throats," but it sounds like a great idea to me. After all, our throats are very important to us. The throat, also called the pharynx, is a muscular, funnel-shaped passageway inside the body that connects the mouth and nose to the esophagus (which leads to the stomach) and to the larynx (which leads to the trachea and then the lungs). So the throat is part of both the respiratory system and the digestive system. It carries air, food, and fluids down from the nose and mouth. The pharynx is the site of many common illnesses, including sore throats and tonsillitis. And given the crazy weather we've had this past winter, it certainly wouldn't hurt to pray for each other's throats!

But here's the other thing I was thinking about. The throat also helps in forming speech. And, oh my, if you're anything like me, it certainly couldn't hurt to have your words blessed! What we say is important, and, if our throats were blessed, we might become more mindful of what we say and when and how we say our words.

Our throats also sing forth praise to God. As we move from Lent to Easter, we will sing, pray, and hear the word, "alleluia," over and over again. Alleluia means simply, "All hail to the One who is." It is the ultimate expression of thanksgiving, the acme of human joy. It says that God is good, and we know it! During this season of alleluias, let us consider a couple of questions: What if our throats have been blessed to sing God's praises all the days of our lives? What if life itself was meant to be one long alleluia moment? No matter what our religion, we would do well to ask the Lord to bless our throats and pray that our words might lift up rather than tear down.

So as the alleluias of Easter approach, may your throat be blessed, may my throat be blessed, and may our lives sing forth praises as we celebrate one long alleluia moment!


