My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Years ago, a sociologist noted that more and more Americans were bowling alone. In 2000, Robert Putnam wrote that fewer Americans were bowling in leagues together. He talked about the decline of "social capital" in American life since 1950 and defined "social capital" as the networks of relationships among people who live and work in a particular community that enable that community to function effectively. A declining social capital means that those networks are shrinking and those relationships are diminishing. He listed various institutions that were losing members, and surprise, surprise! One of them was churches. Fewer and fewer people were going to church then, and unfortunately, that trend continues to gain momentum every year. Wesley Grove certainly can attest to that. I have heard several of you say that you miss the days when more folks were present with us... when Sunday School was full... when the choir was larger... and I know that there are specific folks that you all miss.

I wish I could offer you a simple solution to reverse this trend. I wish I could say we can do this or that and turn the trend of declining church membership around. Or this one little trick will work... I promise! But no one would believe that. For if it were true, we wouldn't be in the spot we are in now.

But I can offer you one suggestion. YOU can invite someone to join us at church. YOU know someone in your life that needs a prayerful, caring community. YOU know a person that is hurting who has lost "social capital" in his or her networks of relationships. When Jesus was nearing the end of His life, he addressed His Disciples, saying that they had learned from Him for three years as their master and Lord. Yet, given what was about to happen on the Cross, their relationship with Him was going to change. He insisted that they were now His friends. FRIENDSHIP. That is the only answer to declining social capital. That is why I am encouraging you to invite a friend to church on Sunday, May 7. It isn't that it is good for Wesley Grove (although it is), it is also good for your friend, and for you, and for all of us. We all need friends.

Here are a few tips that might help when you invite a friend to church...

- **1.** Pray before you invite your friend. God will give you the wisdom and courage to ask them to join you at church, and this is indeed the hardest part... the asking.
- **2.** Ask this person to go WITH you. Plan to meet them at your/their house and carpool together. Or just meet them in the church parking lot and walk in together. Let them know you are going to be looking for them, and they will have a friend there with them. Heck, in this new world we all live in, you could even share the Zoom link and invite them to join you in church virtually.
- **3.** Share with them what church will look like: explain the dress code, whether they should bring Bibles, how long the service will last, who is leading the service, etc. Take away as much of the unknown as possible.
- **4.** Be sure to follow up. After the service, ask them how they liked it, whether they would want to come again, and then let Pastor Karen or me know if you think we should contact your friend. Assure them they are not required to come back, but tell them that we would love to have them come again!

These are just a few ideas. I am praying that this special day in the life of our church goes well. Thank you for inviting your friends to Wesley Grove!



THE ASCENSION OF CHRIST




Jesus rose to Heaven 40 days after His Resurrection to live with His Father.
