From Pastor Nick's Desk ...

## **Me and Paul**

I am sitting in my upstairs office, and I just finished listening to some great music. I wasn't really in a good place, mentally or emotionally, and I just needed to take some time to think. For the past three nights, I have sat in this chair trying to think of something to write. I rarely get writer's block for I rarely am at a loss for words, but this week hasn't been easy. I won't bore you with the details, but I think we all feel like this from time to time.

So, I put on my headphones, turned on the music, and started listening to some wonderful songs that inspire me, hoping that they would give me a few ideas of things to write about. I had my playlist on shuffle, and after a couple of songs, I thought, "Wow, God is good all the time!"

One song that came on is a great song by Willie Nelson called "Me and Paul." It isn't one of his more well-known songs, but it is one of my favorites. This song tells the story of Willie's travels with his friend, Paul, and here are some of the lyrics...

"It's been rough and rocky travelin', but I'm finally standin' upright on the ground. After takin' several readings, I'm surprised to find my mind's still fairly sound. We received our education in the cities of the nation, me and Paul."

Willie goes on to outline the challenging times he has had in his life, but at the end of the song is able to say because of his friendship with Paul, he has overcome the rough and rocky travelin'. I found out tonight that Willie recently wrote a book about his friend, Paul English, who was his drummer for more than 60 years. Paul died in 2020, and that loss has been hard on Willie. The song, "Me and Paul," is a tribute to his friend and the roles he played during difficult times in Willie Nelson's life.

I remember the first time I heard "Me and Paul" — a friend played it for me while we were standing inside a prison cell in Philippi in Northern Greece. About 2,000 years ago, another man named Paul was going through a hard time with a good friend. This Paul and his friend, Silas, had been locked up in this very same cell after they had been severely beaten by a local city official. You may ask what they did while they were in that dark cave of a prison chained to each other? They sang worship songs and praised God all night long. There is another song that I love to hear. It goes like this...

"Paul and Silas bound in jail all night long (repeat 3x)... That ole jailer locked the jail all night long (repeat 3x) ... That ole jail reeled and rocked all night long (repeat 3x)... Saying who shall deliver for me?"

Paul and Silas were able to overcome the darkness of that Philippian jail because they had God with them. Willie and Paul were able to overcome the challenges they faced because they had the close friendship of each other.

I don't know what you are going through right now. Maybe you are locked in your own jail of doubt, or you are overcome by the rocky road upon which you are traveling. I draw encouragement that God speaks to us reminding us to lean on our friends and to lean on Him in the darkest of prisons and on the rockiest of roads we traverse. I pray that God will give you great friends to help you endure your journey and that your friends will be willing to join you even in the darkness of the cells you find yourself locked in and you'll all sing these words together: "Who shall deliver for me?" Who indeed? Praise be to God for delivering us.
