From the Pastor's Desk...

My Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

I've been carrying a short stick around with me these past couple of months. It looks a bit like a wand, and honestly, a magical wand would be useful in my line of work. I could heal wounds, conjure up answers to prayer, and produce awe-inspiring sermons out of thin air. But, truth be told, I stuck this stick in my "preaching bag" to remind myself that if I needed a children's sermon I could talk about that phrase, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me."

But it's not true, you know. Sticks and stones can break our bones AND words can hurt us. Deeply! Some of you are aware of the new "trend" to call people who are obnoxious, a "Karen." "Karen" has become a derogatory term. A deprecating, offensive label. So, where does that leave those of us who bear the name Karen? Who were given that name at birth? I, for one, feel a stab to the gut every time I hear someone refer to a bully as a "Karen." There is a part of me that feels compelled to prove that I am not "one of those."

Words can indeed hurt, and their impact can be profound. Although they may not cause physical harm like sticks and stones, the emotional and psychological damage inflicted by hurtful words can be significant and long-lasting. Therefore, it's essential to recognize the power of words and be mindful of the impact they can have on others.

In Psalm 19:14, we hear the words that are often spoken as a prayer before a sermon: "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, O Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer." I think that this would be a great prayer for us to memorize and repeat each day as a reminder to "mind our tongues." To remind us that our words do, in fact, matter.
