


From the Pastor's Desk...



My Dearly Beloved in Christ,





Chances are you already know that we are entering into Year B, but maybe you don't know. So, let me explain...

The Liturgical Calendar of the Church is a three-year cycle focused around the three Synoptic Gospels. These books are called *synoptic* because they share a similar structure and outlook — so similar that they are said to "see together," which is literally what the Greek word *synoptic* means. The Scriptures in Year A focus on the Gospel of Matthew. Thus, if you noticed, we spent most of this last year reading and talking about Matthew. Now, we are entering into Year B and will focus on the Gospel of Mark. Year C is centered on the words of St. Luke. John's Gospel is not left out of this three-year cycle, but instead, is mixed in throughout. Readings from the Gospel of John occur mostly during the Advent, Lenten, and Eastertide Seasons.

Although the Gospels are the driving factor behind how this three-year cycle is structured, we also have readings from the Old Testament and the Epistles, which follow a particular pattern during this rotation. The Prophet Isaiah is generally read during the Advent Season, but there are also times in the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons when this book is read. The other prophets usually make an appearance during the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons. Most of the remaining Old Testament finds a home during the long stretch after Pentecost that is commonly referred to as Ordinary Time. The one exception is that there is a Psalm for every Sunday of the year. Easter is a special time in the Life of the Church in that there are usually no Old Testament readings read during this time other than the Psalms. The Book of Acts replaces the Old Testament lessons during Eastertide. The Epistles of the New Testament are rotated into the three-year cycle as the fourth reading every Sunday.

Since we are just beginning Advent, let us turn to the four words that rule our Advent experience — Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. Hope is the theme for the First Sunday of Advent. On that day, the Church focuses on Hope and what hope might look like. Hope that Christ will return one day. Also, on this first Sunday of Advent, we pause to light the first purple candle, called the Prophecy Candle, and name our Hope as we await the Coming of the Messiah.

On the Second Sunday of Advent, we focus on Peace. We confess that we are waiting for Peace in a world that is anything but peaceful. We proclaim to the watching world that we who look for the Messiah are called to be a People of Peace. Thus, we light the purple Bethlehem Candle on the Second Sunday of Advent because we know that Peace comes only because of the Child of Bethlehem.

On the Third Sunday of Advent, we turn our attention to Joy. We confess the Joy we have as we await the Messiah. We may sing; we may shout; but whatever we do on the Third Sunday of Advent, we spend time rejoicing. Thus, this day is often called Gaudete Sunday. (*Gaudete* is the Latin word for rejoice.) On this day, we light the pink candle, the Shepherds' Candle, since the shepherds were said to have received the Good News of the Birth of the Messiah with such incredible Joy, which they then shared with all who heard their news.

The Season of Advent is marked by a time of preparing ourselves for the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love that will all accompany the Messiah's (Second) Coming, which we celebrate fully on Christmas Day when we proclaim the Good News to all that our Savior is Born!
