From the Pastor's Desk...

"Dust you are and to dust you shall return."

~~~ (jenesis 3:19 ~~~



Last spring on March 22 at 7:01 pm, just as Carla and I sat down in the fellowship hall at Mt. Tabor to discuss our Lenten study, we received an unexpected phone call. It was Jonathan's phone number, but a strange voice

greeted us: "Mr. Works, your son has been involved in a serious motorcycle crash. You need to go to the Shock Trauma Center in Baltimore. Your son is being airlifted there soon."

Just a few weeks earlier at the Christian celebration of Ash Wednesday, one of the pastors at the ecumenical service for the South Damascus Charge alongside Salem in Brookeville and St. Paul in Laytonville smeared ashes on our heads with this reminder, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." On that Ash Wednesday, we had no idea what our Lenten journey would be like and just how close we would come to returning our only son to dust. Ash Wednesday is a day for us to ponder the reality that we are dust and mortal. But what happens when we are confronted by the reality that it often isn't our mortality that we must confront, but rather the mortality of a dearly beloved one?

Neither Carla nor I were ready to contemplate Jonathan's mortality. But that is exactly the point of the Easter Season, isn't it? We confess that God sent His Only Son into our world as an incarnated person. Jesus faced life and hardships, and ultimately, He was struck down. In the prime of His life as a young man, Jesus would be betrayed by His friends, condemned by His own people, and killed by an unjust government. God did not spare even His own son.

This year, on Valentine's Day, February 14, I will join Pastor Karen, Pastor Emily, Pastor Will, and many of you at Salem UMC in Brookeville. 2023's palm branches will be burned and charred. I will smear ashes on all of our foreheads. I will say to everyone who comes through my line, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

But the Lenten Season won't be the same as last year. Jonathan still bears the marks of his accident, and Carla and I still bear those marks in our memories. Lent is that time when we are reminded that God is powerful enough to bring all of us through the time of dust and mourning. I will think of the people in line for those ashes in just the same way that so many of you supported us with your prayers.

Lent is a time when we are reminded that we are on a journey, but not separate, individual ones. Instead, this journey is one that we are to celebrate together... our common life. No matter what event we face that reminds us that we are but dust, God has gifted us with each other and with His Son, Jesus, who overcame death for our sake, so that we might know that dust and death will not win the day. We may be dust, but thanks be to God, our hopes don't end in dust and ashes. Amen!




