From the Pastor's Desk...

My Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Goodbyes can be difficult. Whether saying farewell to a loved one who has died or letting go of your child's fingers at the bus stop, goodbyes can rip tender pieces of the soul and leave us with inward grief not visible to others. Any loss, big or small, can feel overwhelming as it presses painfully against our happiness. But goodbyes are inevitable, loss unavoidable, and sadness inescapable.



"The word *goodbye* — originally 'God-be-with-ye' or 'Go-with-God' — was a recognition that God was a significant part of the going," writes Joyce Rupp in *Praying Our Goodbyes*. "When you dreaded or feared the journey, there was strength in remembering that the One who gave and cherished life would be there to protect and to console. Goodbye was a blessing of love, proclaiming the belief that if God went with you, you would never be alone; that comfort, strength, and all the other blessings of a loving presence would accompany you." (pp. 17-18)

If we allow our losses to bruise and shatter us, we can become paralyzed, unable to move forward, locked in a tomb of our own making. Our spiritual and physical health demand that we learn the art of "letting go," a practice that teaches us to be patient with ourselves as we acknowledge painful emotions and allow God to heal us as we seek our new beginnings.

During the Season of Easter, we proclaim the resurrection of Jesus, the One who was raised from a dark and empty place, changed and transformed into fullness of life by our Loving God. Spring is also a season of watching that which was once dead return to life. Both the secular and sacred remind us that with every goodbye, there is also a hello. And with every hello, there is also a goodbye. Perhaps it is time for us to let go of some of the burdens that weigh heavily upon us: grief, loss, betrayal, trying to be the best, brightest, and most beautiful. But we must first acknowledge the deep internal ache within each of us and then trust that God will lead us through our sadness and into resurrection.

"When we learn to say goodbye, we truly learn how to say to ourselves and to others: "God be with you. I entrust you to God. The God of strength, courage, comfort, hope, and love is with you. The God who promises to wipe away all tears will hold you close and fill your emptiness. Let go and be free to move on. Do not keep yourself from another step in your homeward journey." (Rupp, p. 30)

Moving forward requires that we let go of what binds us to the past.; to surrender that which has power over our aching hearts and give God those losses which are controlling our lives. The Season of Resurrection awaits us all if we just remain strong and say goodbye to that which keeps us from moving toward our new "hellos."




- Wesley Grove blue aprons


