### From the Pastor's Desk...



Happy December! Merry Christmas!

Thanksgiving has passed; perhaps you celebrated with loved ones, perhaps you hosted 20+ folks, or perhaps it was a small gathering. Either way, the turkeys have been eaten, the cranberry sauce has been passed, and we all got to enjoy pumpkin pie, arguably the best thing since sliced bread. For many people, including my family, there is a tradition to start celebrating Christmas as soon as Thanksgiving is over. After all, Black Friday, Small Business Saturday, and Cyber Monday happen just after. The time between Thanksgiving and Christmas feels like a liminal space, culturally we acknowledge it as a holiday season, but really, it's a time of waiting for the Big Day: Christmas! For many folks, that means shopping all season, decorating to the max, or if you're anything like a Butler-Cefalo, nurturing the homemade fruitcake that's started on Black Friday every year.

All of these festivities, while quite fun and things I deeply enjoy participating in, also feel somewhat skin-deep. The focus can easily turn towards having the best tree, the most perfect gift, or the best Christmas set-up. As you read this, I want you to consider a different way to spend this liminal time.

The First Sunday of December begins the Season of Advent. Advent comes from the Latin word, *adventus*, which means "coming" or "visit." Traditionally, this season is celebrated by remembering and reflecting on the themes of hope, peace, love, and joy while we wait in anticipation for the coming of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

It's appealing to jump straight into Christmas after Thanksgiving. It's fun to decorate the mantle in your family's home with nutcrackers, stockings, and Christmas cards. It's inviting to rush into the *experience* of Christmas, because otherwise, we are left with just being in this liminal space between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Now, to be honest, I have already put up my spouse's, cat's, and my stockings and all of our Christmas decorations, so I'm certainly not advocating for you to not decorate and celebrate.

However, I instead invite you to co-exist with the liminal space. Remember that this season is so much more than gift wrapping, shopping, and decorating. This Season of Advent -- this period of anticipation and waiting --- calls us to do exactly that. As we enter this season, my prayer and hope is that we can all slow down, challenge the societal invitation to fill every waking moment from now to December 24th with shopping, baking, wrapping, or decorating, and instead, just *be.* Allow yourself to wait in anticipation, too. Perhaps as you're hanging your stockings or stringing your lights, you can talk with loved ones about each week's theme of Advent. Slow down, and feel your anticipation build as we wait to see our Messiah and Savior come, not as a mighty giant, but as an innocent baby in a simple barn. That is the true reason for this season, and may we all reflect on just that.

Thank you in advance for helping with this very meaningful community service project during this busy Holiday Season!



The Scates Corporation has completed the replacement of both the hall roof and the parsonage roof. Exterior fascia, soffit, and rake boards have been wrapped in aluminum.

Gutters and downspouts have been replaced at the parsonage.

Septic tanks at both rental houses have been pumped and will be again in October 2025.
