From the Desk of Pastor Nick...

Every January 1, we celebrate a brand-new year, an annual time of tradition and celebration. One time-honored tradition in our culture is the making of New Year's resolutions. At the start of each new year, we re-examine our lives and agree to engage in healthier habits, or we try to eliminate bad habits from our lives. For example, this year, I have decided that I need to eat more food that is bad for me and try to pack on at least 15 additional pounds.

Often, these New Year's resolutions don't make it out of the month of January. We frequently give up on them after just a week or two. I know in my own life that has been the norm. With much good luck and a lot of willpower, this New Year's resolution will meet the same dismal fate other more health-conscious resolutions have met in the past. Since I have never been able to lose weight based on my New Year's resolutions, I am hoping I can reverse psychology my way to a thinner me.

Although weight loss has never been my strong suit, when I became active in the Methodist tradition, I learned of another New Year's habit/tradition. (John Wesley preferred the word habit rather than resolution.) He adopted a prayer from the Puritan tradition that was so important to his mother and father that he rewrote it for the Methodist community of believers.

Traditionally, Wesley encouraged Methodists to pause at the beginning of every new year and participate in a Covenant Renewal Worship Service, in which they pray the Covenant Prayer and rededicate themselves to a life of following Jesus in the upcoming new year. This prayer is a reminder that being Christian is more than just a system of beliefs; instead, it is a commitment to a life of discipleship and devotion to Jesus, the Christ.

I encourage each of you to pause for a moment as this new year of 2025 begins, pray this Wesley Covenant Prayer to yourself, and then make a pledge to God that you are renewing your covenant to be a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ...

"I am no longer my own, but thine.
Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt.
Put me to doing, put me to suffering.
Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee,
exalted for thee or brought low for thee.
Let me be full, let me be empty.
Let me have all things, let me have nothing.
I freely and heartily yield all things
to thy pleasure and disposal.
And now, O Glorious and Blessed God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it.
And the covenant which I have made on Earth,
let it be ratified in Heaven. Amen."


