# From the Desk of Pastor Nick ...

There is a famous hymn in the United Methodist Hymnal titled "Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days,<sup>1</sup>" which is usually sung on the First Sunday of Lent, and maybe even on every Sunday throughout the Lenten Season. Whenever I sing this hymn, I am reminded that Lent has begun. Since 1873, when it was first published, this hymn has served as a marker of the Season just as much as Christmas carols mark the Season of Christmas and two great hymns, "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus" and "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," mark the beginning of the Advent Season.

The hymn was written by Claudia Hernaman, who was born in Surrey, England, in 1838. Claudia was the daughter of an Anglican minister, and she married a minister as well. She was very concerned about the religious education of children and wrote more than 150 hymns to teach them about the Christian Faith.

The hymn, "Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days," was written to illustrate that Jesus' 40-day journey into the wilderness to fast (Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, and Luke 4:1-13) serves as a paradigm for the 40 days of Lent. Jesus was driven by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness to spiritually prepare Himself for the beginning of His ministry. This time of fasting provided Jesus with insights about what His ministry should be and gave Him clarity on how to go about being the Messiah God had sent Him to be. In this way, the Season of Lent echoes for us this wilderness journey of Jesus, so that we also remember to take the time to fast and discern what kind of Christian God is calling us to be.

This hymn provides the narrative framework for us to perform this self-reflection. Ms. Hernaman wrote it in such a way that Christ's life serves as a model for how we should confront our own temptations during our own Lenten journeys. The first two stanzas focus on how Christ responded to temptation, and the last three stanzas encourage us to model our behavior based on His example. The classic Lenten themes are present throughout this wonderful hymn. In stanza one, the focus is on fasting and prayer. Stanza two focuses on struggling with Satan and with sin. In stanza three, we are encouraged to "die to self" and meditate on Scripture. Penitence is encouraged in stanza four, and finally, stanza five reminds us to look forward to the joy of Easter.

The sufferings and temptations of Lent have become a metaphor for human life, with Heaven as the Easter reward at the end. I can't wait to sing this hymn with all of you on the First Sunday of Lent as we begin our journey toward the Cross together, and ultimately, to our Easter reward. Praise be to God!


March will also feature Coffee & Conversation on Sunday, March 9. Please plan to stay after the worship service for a time of fellowship with your church family.




