From Pastor Karen...

My brothers and sisters in Christ:

Before arriving at the South Damascus Charge, I encouraged church leadership to read, "The Power of the Other" by Dr. Henry Cloud, bestselling author and expert on the psychology of leadership. In his book, Cloud posits that "outstanding performance depends on having the right kind of interpersonal connections to fuel personal growth and minimize toxic associations and their effects."

As I studied Cloud's work, it occurred to me that there are many parallels between his research and the Biblical concept of "Covenant:" The enduring commitment between God and God's people to live in a loving relationship with and for each other.

In an effort to engage church members and friends in conversations about our relationships with God, one another, and the world around us, I will be leading **COVENANT BIBLE STUDY** on Thursdays beginning February 16 in two locations: Mt. Tabor UMC (10 - 11:30 a.m.) and Wesley Grove UMC (7 - 8:30 p.m.) in the Education Building. The study is based on the understanding that it is through shared reflection and engagement that we can best discover the Bible's transformative power. It is rooted in the simple idea that we live well when we love well, and underscores the unique relationship that God chooses with us as his people.

COVENANT BIBLE STUDY is broken into three eight-week modules. Each unit emphasizes the biblical concept of covenant as a unifying pattern throughout the entire Bible. The first module, "**CREATING,**" "discusses the story of our origins in Genesis, the Exodus narrative, the teachings of Moses, and the Gospels of Matthew and Mark, as well as other books from each Testament that focus on the foundation of Christian faith. In doing so, it lays out the framework for a life lived "in concert with God and others."

"The goal of **COVENANT BIBLE STUDY** is to deepen our understanding of scripture while also helping us respond together in answering God's call to a faithful life in Jesus. So it embraces a learning experience that builds trust in others and confidence in scripture for each participant — leveraging not just scriptural examples but also personal memories of God's faithful love." (covenantbiblestudy.com)

Through sharing and conversation, participants will apply the Bible to their personal story and gain a deeper trust of God, self, and one another. The participant books for the study are \$20.00 each. Please let me know if you would like a copy. If you are unable to pay for a copy, one will be provided for you. Our first meeting for 2017 will be in March. If you have any 2017 project ideas for Missions, please let us know.




Cemetery Committee


Recycle
