#### From Pastor Karen...

My brothers and sisters in Christ:

Easter is almost here. In a few days only remnants of the holiday will be left around your home: A headless chocolate Easter bunny? A half-eaten, coconut-filled egg? A few sticky peeps poking out of the cellophane package? Some jelly beans perhaps?

We live in a culture that prefers the instant gratification of sweets and chocolate over the confusion of an empty tomb. Yet the season of Easter gives us the opportunity to stand before the empty tomb with the pressing questions of life and its meaning: Why am I here? What is life all about? Is there a purpose? What happens when I die? Why is there suffering in my life? Why is there suffering in the world? Why do people hate? Why do I hate? Where is God in all of this? Why is the tomb empty? If Jesus is raised, why don't people believe it?

The questions seem unending and the search for answers takes us beyond simplicity. The disciples believed, but they did not understand. Are we the same? The empty tomb, the church, the scriptures, and faith are all places of mystery as we encounter the divine.

On April 20 at 7 p.m., the Education Committee will present the film, *The Shack*, in the Education Building. Based on *The New York Times* best-selling novel, *The Shack* is an artistic representation of a deeply personal story that explores encountering God's love. It raises provocative questions and points us toward the path for healing out of impossible tragedy.

The Shack applies to us all, whether we have endured terrible tragedy and pain or the more common struggles of everyday life. Wherever you find yourself on your spiritual journey, we hope you will join us as we continue to explore the questions of Easter.

# Administrative Council Meeting Report

March 12. 2018

**Devotional –** "In All We Do" by Jacqui Richardson, read from the book *Just for Today* by Carol Stone.

**Prayer Requests** – Continue prayers for the Diddles, for Jane Shaub, for Mary Jane Walter, and for our missionary, Jessi Wagner.

**Good News Items** – Chicken and Meatloaf Dinner brought in approximately \$1,600. Tammy and Rick Monarch have cleaned up the back storage room; Tammy has also organized the history display items. Due to the less-than-average snowfall, we have saved money on the snow removal budget. Ally Lind has started as our new music director; her husband, Matt, is playing the piano for rehearsals and for services.

**Action Items** – Tammy made a motion to accept the January 29, 2018 minutes as written and published, Becky seconded, vote taken and approved as written.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Trustees - Mike Sherwood:** To-do list for parsonage is done. Plans are underway to replace the double sink in the main kitchen with a triple sink. HOC will inspect the rental house on March 21. The porch light at the church has been repaired. Consideration is being given to cutting down the large pine tree in front of the Education Building and replacing it with a 15- to 20-foot tree more suitable for the tree lighting planned for December. Other maintenance under way includes having the swing set refurbished and the large crepe myrtle tree pruned significantly. Also, some damage is being done to the Education Building entrance by school bus traffic, and repairs may need to be made.

Christian Education – Tammy Monarch: Sunday School attendance remains low, although it increases when there is breakfast and a missions project. As a side note, "care" packages from the recent project to bag non-perishable meals for the homeless remain available in the Greeting Room. Plans for Vacation Bible School are coming along well. The committee is sponsoring a field trip to the new Museum of the Bible on a Saturday in April, date to be determined.

**Finance – Debbie Benson:** Focus will be a stewardship fundraiser for the fall.

**Worship - Sue Ketchum:** Although Sue could not attend, she submitted highlights to Bob as follow:

- Baby grand piano in the sanctuary and rehearsal piano in the choir room tuned at no charge by one of our church friends, Jack Ahalt.
- The choir is working hard on cantata music as well as learning proper singing techniques.
- The Resurrection Cross will be set up for decorating with donated flowers on Easter.
- Mary Ann will be away April 15 and 22; Pastor Karen will ask Eugenia from Salem if she is available to substitute.
- The Celebrate Damascus Parade is Friday, July 13.
- The order of worship will change back to Doxology, Announcements, Hymn, Benediction.
- Pastor Karen will look into having a group of children ages 5-20, the PSALTY Group, from one of her previous pastoral assignments perform at Wesley Grove sometime this spring.
- Plans for celebrating special Sundays were discussed (Mother's Day, Father's Day, Pentecost with a birthday party for the church on May 20, and Christian Education Sunday).




