HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

I know... I know... This is my newsletter article for December, and I SHOULD be wishing you a Merry Christmas! By the time you read this, our sanctuary will be decorated for the Season, and we will be stepping into Advent with its "watching" and "waiting" for the Son of God to be born among us. But, as I write this letter, we are still a week away from Thanksgiving, and my brain isn't ready to shift gears to the next holiday, so let me say it again...

HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

In his sermon, "Thanksgiving Day," Steve Kelsey writes, "Before it was a noun, 'thanksgiving' was a verb, and the difference matters." He goes on to talk about the many activities that we associate with Thanksgiving, such as watching football, writing our Christmas shopping lists, and gathering around the table to eat, eat, eat. "Have a good Thanksgiving," we say to one another before Turkey Day. And afterward, we ask, "How was your Thanksgiving?" assuming the word to be a noun.

But as a verb, as a spiritual practice, what is *thanksgiving* all about?

Living thankfully is not essentially about feeling thankful, or even being thankful. To live thankfully is to act differently day by day because we are compelled by the Spirit to participate in the generous life of God-with-us, constantly practicing thanks-giving. As followers of Jesus, we are called to move beyond feeling thankful. We are called to give thanks by taking very specific spiritual actions: Practicing hospitality, practicing generosity, practicing stewardship, and practicing compassion. "Thanksgiving is a verb, a spiritual practice, that runs like a golden thread through all we do and all we are as Christians," states Mr. Kelsey.

So, as you start your Christmas shopping and decorating and baking, don't forget to give thanks for all that God has done for you. And even if you don't get what you want under the Christmas tree this year, don't forget to live thankfully and to act thankfully, for the God of abundance rejoices to invite us to join in returning the gifts we have received, to His honor and glory and purpose.



Welcome to Our Newest Wesley Grove Church Family Members!

On Sunday, October 28, all of us here at Wesley Grove were thrilled to receive two new members to our church family! They both have been coming here to worship and serve for several years, so many of us did not even realize that they hadn't already joined. But they have now, and we couldn't be more excited to have them with us!

In an effort to know them a little better, they each submitted these introductions about themselves. Please read these bios and welcome both **Marcus** and **Steven** into our family!

Marcus Hull was born in Westminster and grew up in both Rockville and Germantown. He graduated from Seneca Valley High School in 1987 and then joined the U.S. Army that same year. In 1991, he transitioned back to civilian life and decided to attend Montgomery College, where he went on to pursue and eventually receive his degree in emergency medical services as a paramedic in 1997.

Marcus was then hired by the Montgomery County Police Department, and after a couple of years of service, he decided to move to the financial services industry in 2000. He has just completed his 19th year as a financial advisor with his company, RBC Wealth Management, where he is primarily located in the Frederick branch office.

Marcus has two children, Rileigh (who is a senior at Damascus High School) and Nicko (who is a freshman at DHS), and they currently live in both Damascus and Taylorsville. He, his long-time girlfriend, Susan Boyko, and his children enjoy traveling whenever the opportunity arises and doing things outdoors like hunting, fishing, and sports.

Steven Arndt and his identical twin brother, Craig, were born in Lancaster, California. His family moved four times before he started elementary school, but finally settled in a suburb of Cleveland, Ohio, where he became a Cleveland Indians' and Browns' fan, and of course, a fan of THE Ohio State University.

Steven and his family attended Pheasant Hills United Methodist Church, where he was confirmed. He was active in the Boy Scouts all through school, became an Eagle Scout, and received My God and Country and Virgil Honor Awards. While in high school, he ran track, wrestled, and was active in the marching band and school orchestra. He attended The Ohio State University (also his father's alma mater) in Columbus, where he would eventually receive his bachelor's. master's, and doctorate degrees in engineering. He later attended the University of Maryland to get another masters in engineering. Steven describes himself as the typical nerd in college, complete with slide rule and the "Dungeons and Dragons" group of friends.

After college, he spent a few years working as a consultant in Ohio and teaching engineering at a small school in Georgia. In 1988, he moved to Silver Spring to take a position as a professor at the U.S. Naval Academy teaching mechanical and nuclear engineering. After a few years, it was clear that this position was not a good fit for Steven, so he left Annapolis to take a position at the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. After working in Rockville for a couple of years, the NRC transferred him to Chattanooga, Tennessee, where he worked for five years before moving back to this area, still with the NRC, and settling into his current home.

Throughout his professional career, Steven has been very fortunate to be able to travel extensively (more than 25 countries) and be active in many non-work related professional activities. One of these is working on the Maryland State Board for Professional Engineers, the part of our state government that licenses engineers. Through this organization, he became involved with the Maryland Defense Force (an auxiliary to the Maryland National Guard), where he met the love of his life. his beautiful and talented wife. Linda. They were married just five years ago. They share a number of passions, including travelling. which they do as often as they can, and the love of good friends, which makes them feel very blessed to have become part of Wesley Grove, where everyone has made them feel at home.






