From Pastor John's Pulpit...

"I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." ~~~ Philippians 3:14

I was meditating on this Bible passage, and I realized that I wanted to share it with you all as a source of encouragement. The use of the word, press, in this passage means to exert great strength.

There is a time in long-distance races when the runners have to focus on every bit of energy, discipline, and courage they possess to move on past how they feel. In marathon races, this time is called "the wall." It occurs when a runner has run about 18-22 miles of the 26-mile race. At this point, s/he has passed the halfway mark and made a lot of progress in the second half of the race, but still has quite a distance to go to reach the finish line.

It is the same in our lives as Christians. There are times when it just gets hard. But it is at these times that we learn what it really means to walk by faith, not by feeling. We can't live a victorious Christian life only on the emotional and physical levels. To really experience the victory we have in the Lord, it is imperative that we learn to live in the Spirit and walk by the Spirit. When the flesh is weak and the mind is exhausted, we must still be able to walk through the life-giving power of the Spirit. Learning to both walk and run by faith is part of our spiritual maturity.

Are you discouraged today? If so, press on! Are people trying to hold you back? If so, press on! Are the answers to your prayers being delayed? Are you afraid of what tomorrow holds? Are you feeling lonely and abandoned? If you answered yes to any of these questions, press on! Press on and keep moving by the power of God's Spirit at work within our own spirits. For if we do press on, we will soon see the finish line just ahead and hear the cheers and encouragement reserved for those who press on to the finish. So, again, keep on pressing on!

May the Lord help us all to press on until final victory is won. Blessings to you all...
