From Pastor Karen's Pulpit...

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I write this letter, I am looking out my kitchen window, which is slightly cracked to let in a pleasant, cool breeze. The sun is shining, and I am itching to get outside to breathe in the spring air. Fresh air has a healing quality about it, and in our household, a good dose of fresh air is part of the cure for whatever ails you.

In John 20:19-22, we are told that the resurrected Jesus has just appeared to His fear-filled disciples. He stands among them and offers them peace. Then after showing them the wounds in His hands and in His side, He commissions the disciples to go out into the world to share the good news. "When He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'"

In other words, Jesus offered the disciples fresh air for whatever ailed them. Their doubts, fears, and insecurities were blown away in one cleansing breath of air.

In the Biblical World, breath is a manifestation of God's Spirit: God breathes over the waters, and the universe takes form; God revives dry bones in a valley; and the Psalmist proclaims, "Let everything that breathes praise God." (Psalm 150:6) God's Spirit sets us free; it breathes on us and gives us energy for adventures ahead. God still breathes through us as the source of possibility and as the energy to achieve His vision in our time.

But if we want to receive what God has for us, we have to have breathing space. So take the time to breathe, inhaling and exhaling deeply. Simply breathing our prayers has been shown to reduce stress and enhance immune system functioning. It also awakens our connection with creation, breathing in, around, and through us. So, why not stop right now and try a simple breath prayer? Breathe in God's Spirit. Exhale God's love.

As we continue to celebrate the Resurrection of our Savior and look forward to Pentecost, I pray that you will breathe God's Spirit and share God's energy of love with all creation.
