# From Pastor Karen's Pulpit...

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Several years ago, Malcolm Gladwell wrote a best-selling book titled *The Tipping Point*. The premise was that seemingly insignificant actions can cause major changes in human history. On the cover of the paperback edition, there is a picture of a matchstick. The illustration is never explained in the book, but several implications are clear as you read through the pages. For example, if a seesaw is perfectly balanced, it might take no more than the weight of an additional single matchstick to drop one end of the seesaw to the ground. We would also do right to remember that a tiny match can cause a great flame.

In the balance of everyday life, tiny changes can make a world of difference. That's true of trends, fads, economics, and politics. And it's also true of the human soul. Each one of us, whether we know it or not, has a personal tipping point. Our hearts can be moved, and our lives can be changed forever by the littlest of things.

No one has ever known this better than Jesus, who invited people of all types to alter the direction of their lives by making the smallest of changes. Give a cup of water to someone who thirsts. Pay attention to a child. Welcome the stranger. Look into our own hearts before we criticize our neighbors. Ask God for forgiveness. These are some of the little things Jesus asked us to do. Anyone can do them and they can completely change the balance of our lives.

When Jesus was asked by a lawyer to state the greatest commandment in the law, He came up with two commandments that are seamlessly joined together as one: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul and all your mind. And you shall love your neighbor as yourself.

A tiny matchstick of a saying, but for every one of us, these two commandments are the tipping point. If you love God and love your neighbor, your life will change. When you give away a little more, when you smile a little more, when you choose kindness a little more, when you share your time a little more, or when you seek peace a little more, you may just tip the balance and feel God's perfect love changing your heart and the hearts of those around you for good and forever.


