#### From the Pastor's Desk...

"Jesus said, "There was a man who had two sons..."

~~~ Luke 15:11-32

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With the exception of the parable of the Samaritan, the parable of the Prodigal Son is likely the best known of all Jesus' parables. Perhaps one of the reasons we know this parable is that it seems to represent something of our own life experience. How many of us have been the prodigal? Or perhaps the older brother? Maybe we've been the gracious parent. Perhaps this parable resonated (and still resonates) with the hearers because they want to believe that if they were in the position of the father, they would reach out with open arms to a prodigal son or daughter.

Of course, Jesus wasn't merely giving parenting advice. He was speaking of the divine human relationship. If this is true for a human parent, then surely the same would be true for God. God is pictured as one who is gracious, as one whose arms are open to the one who seeks to be reconciled. In fact, God is pictured here as a father who is looking for his child's return.

It is good to hear that God is always there ready to welcome us home. It is good to know that God will celebrate our return. But what about those who have left us in the lurch? Should we respond in the same way? If God is welcoming us back, then how should we respond to others?

As long as one of our sisters or brothers is broken by the world, cast aside as irrelevant, called a sinner by the rest of us, then we are at a loss, and God's heart is broken. God will never stop reaching for the one because God's love is too wide, God's grace too rich, to cease looking for the lost, for those whom we deem unredeemable.

An unknown author beautifully portrays the possibilities of no-strings-attached love in this heartfelt story titled "The Rock."

As she grew older, her teenage daughter became increasingly rebellious. It culminated late one night when the police arrested her daughter for drunk driving. Mom had to go to the police station to pick her up. They didn't speak until the next afternoon.

Mom broke the tension by giving her a small gift-wrapped box. Her daughter nonchalantly opened it and found a little rock inside. She rolled her eyes and said, "Cute, Mom, what's this for?"

"Read the card," Mom instructed. Her daughter took the card out of the envelope and read it. Tears started to trickle down her cheeks. She got up and lovingly hugged her mom as the card fell to the floor. On the card were these words: "This rock is more than 200,000,000 years old. That is how long it will take before I give up on you."

This mother is not saying, "I will love you IF..." Instead, she says that she will love her daughter forever and nothing can change that. No strings attached.

The story of the prodigal is about God's ever-expanding grace, a grace that will offend our sensibilities and our collective sense of fairness. But God's grace ought to change us if we are its recipients. No strings attached.
