From Pastor YouJung's Pulpit...

As we begin to celebrate the New Year of 2020, we traditionally make resolutions and dream special wishes for the new year. Some people wish and pray thoughts like, "I want to feel better and stay healthy this year," or "I want to lose weight," or "I will spend less money and save more this year." Some of you might even make resolutions like, "I will read through the whole Bible," or "I will set aside some time each day to pray."

I am sure all of you are excited about your dreams and plans for the new year, but there is one thing more important than any of our plans and dreams. It is fulfilling the promise of God in our lives. When God commanded the Israelites, through Moses, to "go into the Promised Land of Canaan and take possession of the land," it seemed impossible for the Hebrew people to enter this land and take it as their own because the people already dwelling there were stronger than them.

But, this command was the Promise of God. He had already given them His Promise, and now was the time for them to fulfill that promise, to experience the results, and to bear the fruits.
