Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There is a famous story about gifted Italian violinist, Niccolo Paganini. One day, he was performing a very difficult piece of music in front of a large audience. While his playing astonished everyone at the concert, all of a sudden, one of the four strings on his violin snapped. Everyone in the hall was frozen with shock and stared at him with worries about how he would handle this unexpected crisis. Paganini frowned briefly, but he continued playing with just three strings. A little while later, a second string snapped, and shortly after that, a third string broke. At this point, the crowd began to murmur and stir in their seats because just a single string remained on Paganini's violin, making it seemingly impossible to finish his performance. However, he appeared unfazed by these unfortunate incidents. Instead of giving up playing the piece, he continued playing with the remaining single string. After he successfully completed this performance, the entire house rose and gave Paganini a standing ovation. Playing with just the one remaining string both surprised and fascinated the audience.

In our lives, we have many strings – a string of health, a string of wealth, a string of knowledge, a string of wisdom, and maybe even a string of fame. Some people might have more strings, while others have fewer. Or some folks might have more powerful strings, while others have weaker ones. Even though everyone has different kinds of strings in his or her life, the fact is that someday all of our strings would snap and hang limply from our lives. All the strings that we currently hold are not going to last forever, and so, those strings that we rely on so much and trust more than God are not worthy of us doing so.

The Psalm writer says that for all you who fear the Lord, trust the Lord instead! He is our helper and our shield. This verse teaches us that we should not lose or break "the string of faith" that connects us to God. Unless we lose or cut it, God will keep this string from breaking, tangling, slackening, or eroding. By trusting in the Lord, this string of faith will be our help when we are in trouble and will be our shield when we are facing danger because God is mighty and powerful and can handle all situations.

I hope we all hold on to our own personal strings of faith tightly, rather than letting go of them, especially in these very stressful and pressured-filled times. Cling to our faith, and it will see us through...

# Spotlight on CAROL STONE

Carol Anne Beck, whose birthday is the first day of this month, was born in Takoma Park in the late 1950's. She grew up on Moffett Road in Silver Spring, in a little community known as Oakview. Carol received her name from the roads her parents took to get to the hospital on the day that she was born — Carroll Ave. and Anne St. She is the middle child of five, having two older

brothers and two younger sisters. She attended Brook View Elementary, Eastern Junior High, and Montgomery Blair High Schools – all here in Montgomery County. Throughout both elementary and junior high, Carol was involved in Girl Scouts, first as a Brownie and later as a Junior and a Cadette. Her mom acted as the troop leader.

Her whole family attended Takoma Park Baptist Church while she was growing up. Both of her parents acted as deacons there, and Sunday School was a large part of her upbringing. After some years of serving at this church, her parents decided to start a new church off of Route 29 and Briggs Chaney Road. They met in what they called, "the house on the hill." This new church had about 30 families with lots of kids, and it was a lot of fun! Carol's first job, at age 14, was collecting money in cans for Arthritics and Friends United. She left that and went to work at a bowling alley in Langley Park. A year later, when she turned 15, she got a job at the Silver Spring Library, where she shelved books after school. She continued working there throughout high school and into college, when she got promoted to a desk assistant position.

Carol graduated from Montgomery Blair High School in 1976 and then started at Montgomery College that next fall, where she majored in Computer Science. After college, she went to work for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Nine years later, she left and went to work for Digital Equipment Corp. But after three years there, she left and returned to work at the FDA. She was hired by Dr. Charles Stone, one of the best managers she had ever worked for. Eventually, when their jobs took them separate directions in the FDA, they started dating and got married in 1997. Carol still works for the FDA as an IT Project Manager. She received my Project Management Professional Certification in 2004.

While looking for a church in 1997 in which to be married, they stumbled upon Wesley Grove. They visited one Sunday, and Charlie recognized his former third grade history teacher, Allan Walter, while Carol recognized Joe and Pat Mallon from Good Shepherd. As a result, they were married at Wesley Grove and have never left. They bought their current house at 5 Exodus Court in Gaithersburg after they were married.

Carol has a daughter named Jennifer, who was 14 when they first came to WG. At that time, someone on the Lay Leadership Committee asked both Carol and Charlie to serve as Sunday School teachers, and they did for several years teaching the youth in our junior high and senior high classes. Carol also became our UMYF Coordinator for many years.

Today, Carol has three grandchildren – Nando, who is 5 and has attended VBS here at WG, and Penelope and Emelia (fraternal twins), who are just one year old. Her hobbies include walking her dog Chip, working out in her yard, and playing with her grandkids. She also loves to sing and cruise with Charlie. They both joined the Damascus Lions Club in 2000, and very recently, Carol was installed as the president of this club for the 2020-2021 year.

### Dear Friends:

Your vote matters. We want the election process to go as smoothly as possible amidst this pandemic. The more people who vote by mail, the shorter the wait times at early voting and election day voting sites. Within the next few days, all registered voters will be receiving an application to request a mail-in (this used to be called an "absentee") ballot.

I cannot say this enough – please vote by mail – and please do not request (unless you have to) the internet/email link, which has to be hand copied and requires two people per ballot to ensure the integrity of the ballot.

You can also request a mail-in ballot right now by texting the letters VBM to 77788, or by visiting either the County Board of Elections website at <a href="https://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/OnlineMailinRequest/InstructionsStep1">777vote.org</a> or the State Board of Elections website at <a href="https://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/OnlineMailinRequest/InstructionsStep1">https://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/OnlineMailinRequest/InstructionsStep1</a>.

The deadline to request a mail-in ballot is Tuesday, October 20.

Mail-in ballots will begin arriving as early as the end of September. There will be about 40 drop boxes available around the County to return your completed ballot if you would prefer that over using the U.S. mail. Later in September, we will announce and publish the locations of these boxes, and despite incorrect comments from some at the national level, these drop boxes are safe. They will be secured to protect your ballot from fraud, and they are not a concern as a transmitter of COVID-19.

If you are not registered to vote, it is not too late. The deadline for voter registration is Tuesday, October 13.
