All of these gifts helped local families to celebrate a very merry Holiday Season. Thanks again to all of you who contributed!

We will continue to collect all types of food for the Damascus HELP Food Pantry, including but not limited to peanut butter, jelly, macaroni and cheese mixes, stuffing mixes, canned vegetables (especially those other than green beans and corn), and diapers (especially the larger sizes of 4-6).


