Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There were two sisters living out in the countryside. Even though they struggled to live faithful lives in God, they felt their lives' problems were just too overwhelming for them to bear. Often, they said aloud to our God, "This is too difficult. Lord, it's just too hard to live in this world. Our lives are so harsh."

One day, in a dream, they were each dragging a large cross. They soon found that their crosses were just too big and too heavy to carry. So, they asked Jesus, whom they met in the dream, to help them to make these crosses easier to manage. "Jesus," they said, "it is so hard for us to carry our crosses. We know that you are a carpenter. Please cut the crosses down in size for us." So Jesus cut their crosses off as they had asked. They again asked Him three more times throughout this dream to cut them down in size. Thus, their crosses became much lighter and much shorter, making them much more comfortable and easy to carry.

The sisters then continued on in their travel toward the Jordan River very easily and very quickly due to their small and light-weighted crosses. When they arrived, they saw many people crossing the river by putting their crosses upon the river and using them as bridges to help them cross over and into Heaven. Following these examples, the sisters tried putting their crosses on the river as well, but, unfortunately, theirs were worthless functioning as bridges because their shortened lengths did not allow them to reach the other side. Their crosses were also too light to hold the weight of the sisters.. And although they had tried to reach Jesus, He was already gone. In desperation, they plopped back down to the ground.

They both awoke from their dreams and heard the voice of the Lord, saying to them, "If anyone wants to come after me, deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow me." (Matthew 16:24) The sisters cried out, shouting, "Amen! Amen! Amen, Lord!"

This story reminds us that carrying our own crosses is necessary for us as Christians, as the disciples of Jesus Christ. Carrying the Cross is sometimes very difficult, for us, and we

sometimes want to give up bearing the Cross's weight. As we experience troubles, tribulations, trials, and suffering in our lives, we are more likely to fall, collapse, and just give up. However, we need to remember that there is no resurrection, no eternal life, no glory, and no Heaven without the Cross. Just as Jesus suffered and sacrificed Himself for us on the Cross, we must spend this Lenten season denying ourselves, taking up our crosses, and following Him. This is **the way** to honor the power of Jesus' Cross, which allowed His resurrection to become our resurrection and His victory to become our victory. So, let us not live the life we've been living, but the life of Christ that lives within us. (Galatians 2:20)



their mother's home in western North Carolina.


