¹ Praise the Lord! I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart, in the company of the upright, in the congregation...

⁴ He has made His wonderful works to be remembered...

¹⁰ The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding.

His praise endures forever.

I like the way Scott Hoezee describes this poem: "Psalm 111 is a shook-up bottle of champagne — when the cork flies off, it is effervescent, effusive, and thus, it is delightfully over the top in most every way. From first to last, the psalm jumps up and down with enthusiasm for God, for God's character, for God's works."

Psalm 111 is a joyful litany of wonder over God's nature and works. But, I must admit that sometimes it's easy for our inner dialogue to get bogged down with the problems in this world. While Covid-19 is defining our lives and determining our every move, and while political scandals shake our nation and world, it is easy to focus on the negatives rather than on God's goodness. But in the midst of all of this, God asks us to develop a keen eye and ear to see and listen for the greatness of Him and His works.

One line that jumped out at me when reading Psalm 111 comes in verse 4 when the psalmist says of God, "He has caused His deeds to be remembered." How do we cause God's deeds to be remembered? That happens when we talk about God stuff, share God stories, and pass them along to the next generation.

In short, God causes His deeds to be remembered through us and through our own familiarity with and enthusiasm for His Word. Which leads me to wonder: does this characterize our lives? Do our children and neighbors have a chance to see that we lean into the effervescent enthusiasm of Psalm 111 on a regular basis? Related to this is another question: do we train our eyes to look for signs of God's goodness in the world? Where is God active today via His Spirit? Where do we see signs that God is active and on the move right now?

Yes, Psalm 111:4 is correct --- God has caused His deeds to be remembered. That is why we are celebrating Good Friday and Easter this week, so that we might remember God's glorious deeds of Christ's death and resurrection. But we must remember — the ongoing calling in our lives is to do everything we can to let the Holy Spirit jog our memories of God each and every day.


On Holy Saturday until noon on Easter Sunday, please drop off cut spring flowers (either from your yard or from the store)



Jim and Rick are also getting gutter replacement and gutter guard prices for the pavilion and various places on the hall.

Worship --- Within the next two weeks, the winter decorations will be coming down in the church, and our new spring and Easter decorations will be going up. Services will resume in the Sanctuary on Easter morning, while continuing to follow all of the current Covid restrictions and guidelines. We are still looking for volunteers to serve as liturgists, soloists, etc. Please contact Tammy if you are willing.

Pastor's Report: Karen asks that we open our hearts with love and justice and that God will continue to show us ways to find joy and meaning in our daily lives. The Rev. 
