From the Pastor's Desk...

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

All things bright and beautiful, all creatures great and small, all things wise and wonderful, the Lord God made them all. Each little flower that opens, each little bird that sings, He made their glowing colors, He made their tiny wings.

I have a beautiful life. Everywhere I look is beauty. I have two daughters who brighten my life with their inward and outward beauty. I live in a beautiful house surrounded by the beautiful countryside of Woodfield, Maryland. I have friends whose souls are as beautiful as the Kingdom of God itself. And I am the pastor of three beautiful churches whose members daily fill the world with delightful discipleship. How blessed am I to live in a world filled with God's beauty!

The hymn, "All Things Bright and Beautiful," was written by Folliott Pierpoint, a classical scholar who lived a leisurely life in the lovely town of Bath, England. This hymn praises God for a host of beauties – things that we encounter in everyday living, but often fail to appreciate — the beauty of the Earth and skies, the beauty of each hour, the joy of ear and eye, and the joy of human love. It also expresses thanksgiving for the Church — and for Christ.

So often, we expect God to show up in BIG ways. We want spectacle, drama, fireworks. We look for signs and symbols of God's coming. We plan and prepare and organize our calendars anticipating that God will bless our many activities. But the Kingdom of God doesn't come with the waving of wands and the snapping of fingers. It comes in quiet and often secret ways. Sometimes, we just need to take time to look around us and enjoy the beauty that God has bestowed upon us.

I think St. Augustine said it best...

"Question the beauty of the Earth, question the beauty of the sea, question the beauty of the air, amply spread around everywhere, question the beauty of the sky, question the serried ranks of the stars, question the sun making the day glorious with its bright beams, question the moon tempering the darkness of the following night with its shining rays, question the animals that move in the waters, that amble about on dry land, that fly in the air; their souls hidden, their bodies evident; the visible bodies needing to be controlled, the invisible souls controlling them; question all these things. They all answer you, 'Here we are. Look! we're beautiful.'" --- Sermons, 241, Easter: c.411 A.D.

This fall, I encourage you to take some time to enjoy the beauty of God's Earth. Revel in its complexity and its diversity. And determine to be more intentional about seeing and appreciating the many beauties and joys that God has placed at our disposal.

Opening: Bob began the meeting at 7:31 pm.

Devotions:

Cathy read from a poem about women working on the road to life. The main focus being that basic common sense leads to a happy and joy-filled life given to us by God. She then led us in prayer.

Prayer Requests:

* Susanne Mershon, a good friend of Cathy's, has MS and is at home with Hospice. We pray for a peaceful end to her life.

Good News Items:

- * Our Parsonage Clean-Up Day was successful with 14 volunteers present. We trimmed bushes, cut down trees, cleaned out gutters, and pulled a lot of weeds.
- * Jonathan Works will be home from Army Reserves basic training this Friday.
- * Roberta's living facility is out of lock-down, and she can once again leave her room and see people.
- * Our Fall Community Yard Sale is once again happening this Saturday and our church picnic on Sunday!
- * The Damascus Lions Club is eating and meeting here once again.

Old Minutes:

Rick motioned to approve the minutes from our July meeting, Steven seconded, and all were in favor.

Old Business:

* Trustees and any others who can help will paint fresh lines on our parking lot spaces this Thursday.

New Business:

* The Church received a request for a donation to help support the Strawbridge Home and Shrine in New Windsor. Tammy passed this on the Missions Committee.

Committee Reports:

<u>Communications</u> – We continue to send cards to all in need just to let them know that their church family is thinking of them and praying for them. We have added several updates to our Facebook page. Our 2022 budget request has been given to the Finance Committee.

Education – Our weekly Sunday School/confirmation class will resume on Sunday, September 26 at 9 am with Pastor Karen, Pastor Nick, and Tammy all planning and teaching these lessons. We plan to hold Confirmation Sunday in late October or early November. Pastor Nick is also beginning a virtual group study tomorrow night on the Apostles' Creed. All are invited and encouraged to "Zoom" in at 7:30 pm.

Fellowship — Our Fall Community Yard Sale is this coming Saturday from 9 am to 2 pm. Let Becky know if you can help. Our annual Church Picnic will take place after our outdoor worship service the next day. Plan to come at 10 am for the service and then spend the afternoon eating some delicious foods and enjoying some time with your church family. We hope to host a "hybrid indoor/outdoor" fall craft sale in late October. Tammy is currently surveying crafters to determine their interest and availability. Mark your calendars with these Christmas events --- Thursday, December 2 for our annual Community Tree Lighting Ceremony and Sunday, December 19 for a new event, our Community Christmas Caroling Parade. More details on both of these events will be forthcoming.

<u>Finance</u> – Our income and expenses are continuing to do well. All of our bills are paid, and we have money in the bank. In August, our expenses exceeded our income, but otherwise since March 2020, our income has been higher than our bills during most months. We are beginning to work on the 2022 budget. All committee chairs have been given budget request worksheets and asked to return them to Rick by Wednesday, October 20.

Missions – Thanks to all who donated school supplies to fill the backpacks of needy students in our community when they returned to school two weeks ago! We are currently collecting canned vegetables for Damascus HELP. We are meeting on October 11 to prepare our budget request, think about our mission projects for next year, and hopefully plan our community holiday giving projects for this Christmas Season if we get input from Faith Connections before then.

<u>SPRC</u> – On behalf of this committee, Terri recommended a 2% raise for Pastor Karen for 2022. Rick seconded this motion, and all were in favor. We will meet this Sunday during the picnic to discuss some issues dealing with the various Church Conference reports and then submit this information by October 1. We have not yet advertised for a new Music Director, but we plan to speak with a music student at Montgomery College to determine his level of interest and availability in 2022. Hiring for this position is in limbo due to the current Covid situation.

<u>Trustees</u> – Parsonage Clean-up Day on August 28 was very successful with 14 people there to help. During this time, it was noted that a downspout on the right-hand side of the garage is missing and will be replaced. We will repaint our parking lot lines this Thursday, September 16 at 9 am. Kitchen work is coming along with Terri and Jimmy taking care of this. Jim is working with roofers to determine the feasibility of placing gutter guards on the mental roof of the rental house. He is also looking into replacing the HVAC system in that house. He estimates the current one to be 40-50 years old. Pastor Karen mentioned that one of the pieces of playground equipment by the pavilion is broken and needs to be repaired.

<u>Worship</u> – Our worship time will return to 11 am on Sunday, September 26. Our summer decorations will be replaced with fall ones on this day. Becky, Josh, and Sue met in August to review and organize music as well as to make tentative plans for the fall. Covid restrictions continue to impact our music program. A small choral group will sing at our outdoor service this Sunday and then periodically throughout the fall in our Sanctuary while wearing masks. Our hand bell quartet will also perform occasionally until the end of the year.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Karen reflected on the fact that Betty Duvall always ends their phone calls by saying, "I love you." Love of God, love of neighbor, and love of self – we gather to enact that love tonight. We show our love for each other in various ways – sharing homegrown vegetables after church, planning musical selections to enrich our worship services, sending cards to remind folks that they're not forgotten, and participating in confirmation vows to declare our status as Christians. All of these are ways we show our love for ourselves, each other, and our Most Gracious God. Over the last month, Pastor Karen has made about 60 calls to at-home and hospitalized members, but only a few actual visits although things are starting to finally happen again.
