My Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The year is 1521. In Germany, the nobles and clerics of the German Church have gathered to put one mad monk named Martin on trial for heresy. The Catholic Church is marshalling its strength to combat the growing tide of protestors like Martin Luther in Germany and Ulrich Zwingli in Switzerland.

At the same time, one monarch has the notion to write a theological treatise defending the Catholic faith from these Protestants: King Henry VIII of England. Henry is appalled that Luther and many German nobles like him are breaking from the Church over doctrines and practices that have long been central to the faith in the European Church. This treatise written by Henry is read by the Pope, and Henry is celebrated with an official title granted to him and all of his future descendants. He is proclaimed "Defender of the Faith."

Even to this day, when the entire title of the English monarch is spoken aloud, you will always hear this title mixed in with several others. When Charles was crowned king a little over a year ago, he was proclaimed, "Charles III, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and His other realms and Territories, King, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith."

Defender of the Faith: Henry received this title for defending his Catholic faith in 1521. An odd twist of historical fate is that just 13 years later in 1534, Henry was no longer defending the Catholic faith, but rather, he was actively undermining it. It is popularly believed that Henry left the Catholic Church because the Pope refused to grant him an annulment from his wife, Catherine of Aragon, so that he could marry another, hopefully more fertile, woman named Anne Boleyn. History has made this narrative pretty famous. There are TV shows about Henry, Catherine, Anne, and the many other women of the Tudor family. There are also books, movies, and even one very funny song about Henry the 8th..."I am, I am."

The truth is that Henry did break from the Catholic Church because of his dissatisfaction with his wife, but there were a host of other reasons as well. He had once believed that the Protestants were wrong to criticize and leave the Church for what they saw as failings. He also thought their positions were too reactionary. One example of this is the doctrine of Christ's presence in the Lord's Supper. Catholics believe that when a priest blesses a wafer and chalice of wine, the bread changes into the actual body of Jesus, and the wine changes into the actual blood of Christ. This is the doctrine of *transubstantiation*. The Church had always taught that bread and wine are changed into the body of Jesus because in John 6:53-56, Jesus says, "Unless you eat my body and drink my blood, you have no life in me." Therefore, we must eat and drink the very body and blood of Jesus.

The Protestants say this is just a metaphor — the body and blood of Jesus are symbolically present in the meal we take at the Lord's Table, not actually present. Henry saw this debate from both the Catholic perspective and from the Protestant perspective, and then, he suggested that we try a third way of looking at this, a middle way. He developed the concept

of consubstantiation, which states that the bread and wine are indeed both bread and wine, but they are also the actual body and blood of Jesus. This doctrine is a both/and belief, not an either/or belief, and it is what the Anglican tradition (known today as the Episcopal Church) is most known for. These followers can view a problem from both sides of the issue and then think to themselves. Can we visualize this same problem in a third way that is somewhere in between the other two views?

This is what I love about the Anglican/Episcopal tradition. These Christians often seek to find a third or middle way. We no longer live in a world of black and white, but we do live in a world that constantly asks us to take sides. We are often told we should pick this side or that side: in politics, in elections, in social and ethical issues. We could take any disagreement in the Church or in the world today, and if we were to follow our Anglican/Episcopal ancestors, we could, or even should, be looking for a different solution — a third way — to reach mutual satisfaction.

Thanks be to God for a king that was willing to step back and examine his own theological understanding when he was older. Thus, I encourage each of you still today to be willing to look back at various conflicts and problems and then say to yourself:

How can I view this problem or challenge in a third, and yes, different way, but one that is still mutually acceptable for all of those involved???
